"Radiology Partners filed a motion to dismiss a 2023 complaint filed by United Healthcare (UHC) in California federal court. That complaint was stayed in September 2023 when the court cited the insurer's allegations were substantively identical to claims in an arbitration already underway between UHC and RP-affiliated practice Singleton Associates, P.A. (SAPA), and that all the allegations were subject to contracts requiring arbitration. A year has passed, and the already underway arbitration has concluded, and there's no reason for the California complaint to remain on the court's docket.

Since 2022, SAPA has been engaged in a lengthy arbitration with United Healthcare (UHC) of Texas. The dispute was based on underpayments by UHC under the then-existing agreement with SAPA. In response, UHC made its own allegations against SAPA. After several phases of arbitration and multiple changes in membership of the arbitration panel, the arbitrators determined neither party is entitled to recover anything from the other. While the result was surprising and unsatisfying, we are nevertheless pleased that the panel rejected any recovery to UHC on its allegations regarding our affiliated practice.

We stand by the integrity of RP and our affiliated practices, and we are proud of the high-quality radiology services our physicians provide to Texas patients, including UHC members, and will always strive to achieve and protect reasonable reimbursement for physicians that supports the care patients deserve."
